Transcription Methodology:

The entries were transcribed word-for-word from the original except in cases where a misspelling was obvious.

Standard genealogical practices were followed. No assumptions were made between various spellings of a name. For example, the names Fan, Fann, Fanny, and Fannie were not assumed to be the same person and were not combined or changed to be the same spelling.

The entries from Elizabeth O. Carter's diary were often challenging because she abbreviated names. But she was fairly consistent in referring to African Americans by their first name only. Certain people were exceptions, such as Jacob and Sophia Howard.
